Healing is a Choice...Blocks To Healing: Although healing has always been part of God's Plan for us, not everyone is healed. This is mystery and requires ongoing faith in God's goodness and God's perfect will. There are times in ministry, here among you that I am asked why God heals some and not others. The Gospels tell us about Jesus healing the sick, who come to Him and even those who cannot approach Him. But, it is also reasonable to look at some personal reasons for blocked healing.

Ultimately, healing is *work*. It just does not happen with the wave of a wand or the taking of a pill. It is true that Jesus has said "ask and it will be given you", (Matthew 7:7) but the asking requires not just a sincerity of faith, but also a willingness to do what God may ask in return. In this sense, there can be a 'cost' for the healing. Consider the case of Naaman, (2 Kings 5:1-15), the great Aramean military victor who would have bypassed his opportunity for healing from leprosy rather than bathe in the Jordon River. The cost was small in effort, but large because of pride. Naaman sought only physical healing. But, (as many of us come to learn), God had a bigger plan.

Healing may also require *persistence*. Consider the case of the Syrophoenician woman (Mark 7:24-29). How easy it would have been to remain a victim and walk away saying "I tried but even Jesus wasn't interested in healing my daughter". Perhaps God had a plan for her healing, and not just for her daughter, and this came only with her persistence.

Healing can also require at times a *willingness to feel the pain*, to acknowledge it, in order to be freed from it. If an individual has invested a lifetime in burying the pain, or hiding from it, sometimes it is easier to remain in the pain rather than to have to acknowledge it and feel it. Similarly, when one has lived with a certain wound for a long time, it can become comfortable, familiar, even if disliked. It can become the excuse for not doing what would be in one's best interest to do e.g. taking responsibility for one's life, for one's sins and failures. I often suspect that this may very well be why God asks persistence in seeking healing, at times, or requires some cooperative action on our part. If one asks God for healing, but is still hanging onto one's pain or fear or false beliefs, God will not violate an individual's free will. God sees the heart and God responds to invitation. God will not go where God is not invited.

Steve Arterburn has written a helpful book with this very title (Healing is a Choice, Thomas Nelson, Inc., Nashville, Tennessee) and may be good reading over the summer for further insight and information for those interested.

Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ June 6, 2010

First Reading: Genesis 14: 18-20

Melchizedek, a priest of God, prayed that Abram would be blessed by God. He also praised God for delivering Abram's foes into his hands.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 11: 23-26

Paul describes Jesus' actions during the last supper. Jesus broke bread and said it was his body given for us, asking that we do the same in remembrance of him. He then passed the cup and called it his blood. Jesus then asked us to break bread in this manner to remember his death until he returns.

Gospel: Luke 9: 11b-17

Jesus asked the disciples to give the crowd something to eat, but they had only five loaves of bread and two fish. Jesus then blessed and distributed the food, which fed about 5,000 people.
